What is camera Mapping?

Camera Mapping is a part of the Bellaire Police Department's Safe Neighbor-

hood Initiative in which the Police Department creates a map showing location of known security camera systems. Should a crime occur, police and detectives could view the map and identify locations where camera systems are in place. Police can then contact the home or business owner and ask to check video on the date of the offense to see if the suspects or their vehicle may have been captured on video. Currently when a crime occurs in an area, police walk the neighborhood looking for external cameras on homes and businesses.

Join the camera mapping program today!

You will only be contacted by the Bellaire Police Department in the future if there is a criminal incident in the vicinity of your security camera. Police personnel, if necessary, may request a copy of any video captured by your camera, which may assist in the investigation of a crime.

How does it work?

The Camera Mapping Program asks home owners and business owners to list their closed circuit security systems with the Police Department. The Bellaire Police Department is not asking to monitor your system, control your system, or directly access your system in any way. We just want to know where systems are as an investigative tool. Should a crime happen, we will come to you and ask if your system can be checked for a prescribed time period. You waive no rights to privacy by joining this program. At any time you can remove yourself or tell us that you do not want to participate.

What are the benefits?

You, your neighbors, and your community benefit. You purchased and installed a camera system for the safety of your family, home, or business. Cameras act as a deterrent, but their greatest benefit is in assisting police identify and arrest criminals. Although you may not have been the victim of the crime being investigated, the suspect was on your street, in your neighborhood, or at your business. Our goal is to identify them and get them out of our community or next time you may be their victim.

What information is necessary?

To participate, you will need to provide the following:

- 1. The name and address of your location.
- 2. Contact information for the owner or operator of the security camera system.
- 3. Details regarding your security camera system, such as the type of system, number of cameras, areas covered by the cameras, recording and retention periods, etc.
